➔ A Soldier was killed in a motorcycle accident Jan. 11 at approximately 1820 local in El Paso, Texas. The Soldier was operating his 1999 Yamaha R-1 motorcycle at a high rate of speed when he collided into the back of a semi-trailer. He was wearing the required personal protective equipment.

**COST: 1 Soldier Killed**

➔ A Soldier was killed and another injured in a vehicle accident Jan. 12 at approximately 1903 local in Killeen, Texas. The Soldier was driving a Ford Focus with another Soldier at a high rate of speed, weaving in and out of traffic. The vehicle reportedly ran onto a curb and struck a telephone pole and a tree, became airborne, and ejected the driver. Alcohol was reported as a contributing factor and neither Soldier was wearing a seat belt. The U.S. Army Combat Readiness/Safety Center is investigating the accident.

**COST: 1 Soldier Killed  
1 Soldier Injured**

➔ Two Soldiers were killed in a vehicle accident Jan. 13 at approximately 1330 local in Walker County, Ga. The Soldiers were high school split-training option Soldiers returning from drill. One of the Soldiers was driving a 1999 Mitsubishi Mirage when she attempted to negotiate a curve at a high rate of speed, lost control and struck a tree. Both Soldiers were wearing their seat belts.

**COST: 2 Soldier Killed**

➔ A Soldier was killed in a motorcycle accident Jan. 15 at approximately 1830 local in Denham Springs, La. The Soldier was operating his motorcycle when he collided into the back of another vehicle and was thrown. The Soldier was wearing his helmet and the required PPE.

**COST: 1 Soldier Killed**

➔ A Soldier was killed in a parachute accident Jan. 16 at 1200 local at the Laurinburg-Maxton Airport near Ft Bragg, N.C. The Soldier became entangled with jumper while participating in High Altitude Low Opening (HALO) parachute training. The U.S. Army Combat Readiness/Safety Center is investigating the accident.
